



# **Shine On Kingston! Program**

## **January 14 – 16, 2022**

In addition to encouraging the whole town to add lights and SHINE ON for the duration of the celebrations, the program includes:

### **1. In the District Hall, Agnes St: *January 13<sup>th</sup> – 20<sup>th</sup>***

- an Australian National Maritime Museum touring exhibition, *Remarkable Boats*.
- a display of excerpts from the Cape Jaffa Light station Logbooks, with transcriptions
- a display of drone photography images featuring the old lighthouse platform and lightkeepers' cottage ruins at Cape Jaffa
- a display of the Tempestry Project, with connections to historic moments in life of the Lighthouse
- an exhibition of images from Nicolas Baudin's 1802 expedition in this area

### **2. In the small space studio, Agnes St: *January 14<sup>th</sup> – 20<sup>th</sup>***

- exhibition of entries in the inaugural *Lighthouse Art Prize* (2D, 3D (sculpture) and Photography categories) - all with the LIGHTHOUSE theme.

### **3. In the Bay and on the Foreshore in front of the Lighthouse**

- The Sailing Club regatta will be held on Saturday in front of the Lighthouse
- Display of Marine Rescue boats
- Kids' activities
- Adelaide Kite Flyers display – during the day and illuminated kites after dark.

### **4. At the Lighthouse**

- Food: Lighthouse Keeper's Breakfast, Lighthouse Long Lunch, Lighthouse Keeper's BBQ
- Drinks: Local wines
- Costumed actors.
- Guest Speakers: - Ian Clifford, President, Lighthouses of Australia
  - Garry Searle, author of "First Order: Australia's Highway of Lighthouses": Lighthouse illumination
  - Anne Daw, daughter of Verne McLaren: relocating the lighthouse
  - Sarah-Jane Lakshman, Australian Maritime Safety Authority (AMSA): Heritage lighthouses
  - Robert Mock: Saving the light station platform.
  - Steve Saville: the *Nyora* wreck discovery.
  - Graham Rayner: the last lightkeeper at Cape Jaffa Lighthouse
  - Mark Rothall and Scott Gluyas: the danger today; recent rescues.
- Other guests:
  - John Nicholson, author of "Cape Jaffa: its memorial to seafarers, fisherman, lightkeepers".
  - John Ibbotson, author of "Lighthouses of Australia".

- Tours of Lighthouse constantly.
- Dr Darren Peacock, CEO, NTSA, will emcee the Friday night dinner for lightkeeper descendants and special guests, and the NTSA President, Paul Leadbeter, will open the event on Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> at 10am.
- Illumination of the Lighthouse – a spectacular nightly display, 15<sup>th</sup>-24<sup>th</sup> Jan.
- Music: Graham Hugo (Country) on stage in the evening, an acoustic guitarist playing inside Lighthouse, Ukulele group *Mosquito Plains Strummers*, Community choir singing sea shanties. Background music throughout the day.
- Kingston Community Theatre production based on the Lighthouse story.
- Night Tours every night from the 15<sup>th</sup> (first night the CJL light was exhibited) to the 24<sup>th</sup> (official opening of Lighthouse in 1872).

**5. Kingston Museum, Cooke St**

- exhibition of marine/fishing materials and relevant documents

**6. Along Marine Parade, in the evening**

- A Lantern parade from the jetty to the Lighthouse, led by bagpiper, concluding with a dramatic finish!

**7. From the Lighthouse to Cape Jaffa: *January 16<sup>th</sup>***

- Charter trips to the platform
- Cottage ruins with guides on site
